

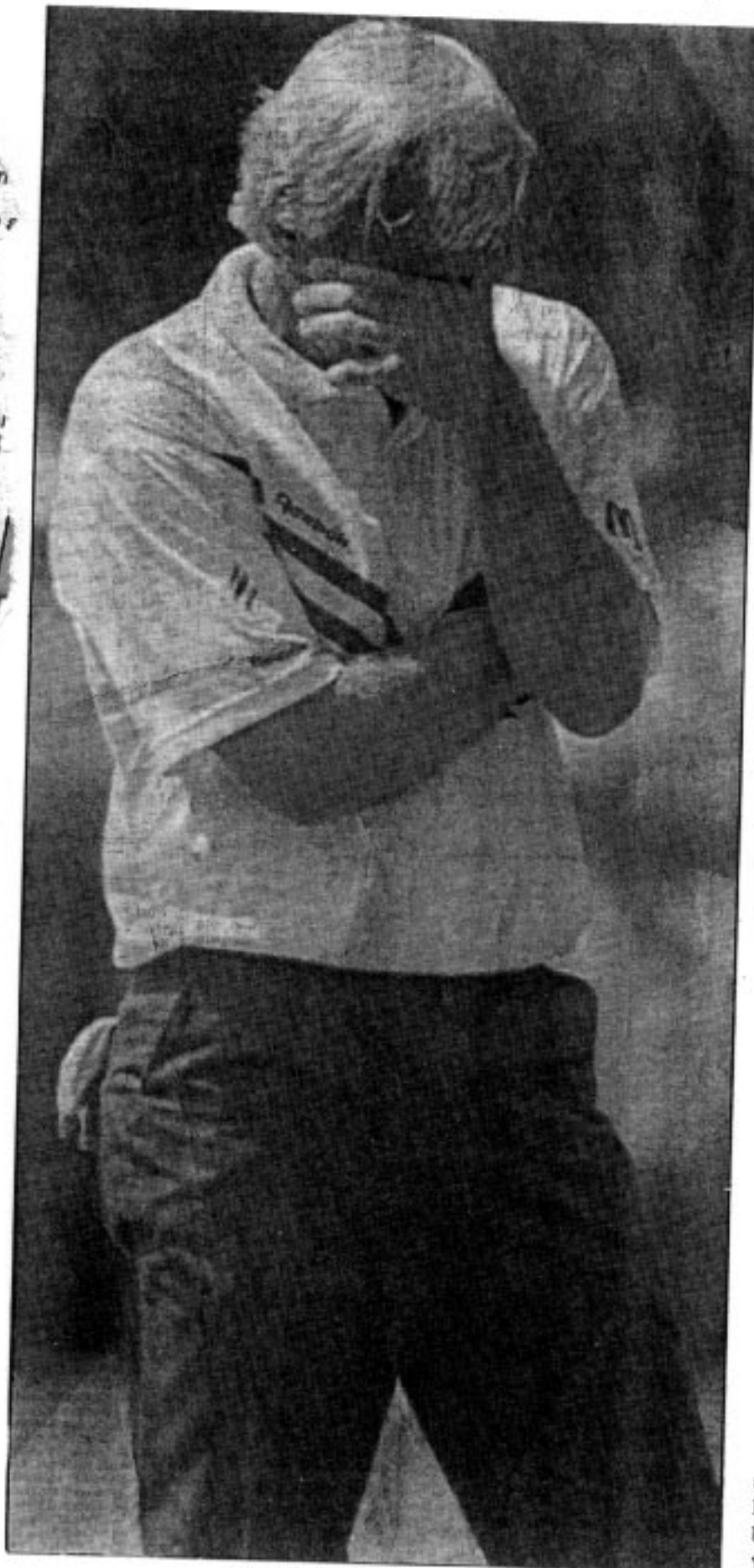

Greg Norman breaks down

Golf's new star soars

Norman broken by newcomer's eagle

KNOXVILLE - Golf pro Greg Norman lost his famous cool today at the prestigious Johnny Knoxville Scrotum Masters golf tournament held at the Twilight Zone Golf Course and Trailer Park. Newcomer John Fairstein drove an Eagle off the difficult 18th hole to finish the day at 59, searing Norman by two in the hotly contested final round of the Tournament. Norman, trembling, with tears in his eyes, was rushed to Lakeshore for sedation and observation.

At a press conference held at Jerry's on Clinton Highway, Fairstein recounted the thrill of his first Eagle, "I popped an X'ed-out Titleist off the tee. It soared up and out, first hooked right, then hooked left, finally bouncing off a double-wide into the hole!". When told of Norman's hospitalization Fairstein expressed regret, "I knew something was wrong when I saw Greg's caddy hand him a roll of toilet paper."
